## **RSWSFC Virtual Club Meeting May 18, 2021**

The virtual RSWSF Club Meeting was called to order at 7:00PM via ZOOM, Chuck Ward club VP introduced the speaker and meeting sponsor Nick of Chasin' Tails Tackle Shop & Guide Service.

#### Topic: Spanish Mackerel Fishing

Nick of Chasing Tails is a fishing guide who works at the Atlantic Beach Causeway store and joined RSWSF Club meeting via Zoom. Nick said the Spanish Mackerel bite is improving and be in full swing by the time of the club's Spanish Mackerel fishing tournament. Ocean water temperatures have been in the low 60's and will continue to warm. He said the Atlantic Bonitos are still in the area for a few more weeks, and Cobia have started showing up around Cape Lookout; catching Mahi mahi has been slow due to high winds and rough seas.

**Spanish Mackerel fishing:** Nick prefers using fishing rods over hand lines. He spools his reels with 20# High Viz monofilament fishing line attached to a #1 planner (sometimes #2 planner) attached to a 20' to 30' fluorocarbon leader line. His bait of choice for trolling is a size 00 Alt silver Clarkspoon which he stressed is a very small spoon. A Clarkspoon Squid is one of his favorites because it is manufactured using a ball bearing swivel that reduces twisting and spinning of the spoon. The artificial bait tied to a 20' fluorocarbon leader and #1 planner keeps the spoon several feet below the water surface. Using a #2 planner will dive the spoon deeper.

Trolling weights are an option when trolling near shore in shallow waters for Spanish Mackerel, because planners will hit bottom and trip. Once a school of Spanish is located by trolling, Nick recommends casting metal jigs such as Blue Water Candy lures or Clarkspoon casting jig towards the shoreline. The jigs need time to sink down; therefore, count off a several seconds after casting then rip the lure back towards the boat. Spanish Mackerel will chase down and hit the metal bait. Nick also suggests using these metal jigs and technique when fishing for schools of Bonito or jigging for Gray Trout. Nick's favorite casting fishing rod is a Star Rod "Sequence" Fast Taper. <a href="https://www.starfishingtackle.com/sequence-spinning-fast-taper">https://www.starfishingtackle.com/sequence-spinning-fast-taper</a>

Another suggestion when fishing for Spanish using the center trolling rod as the long line with a "Bird" and a 20' leader with a Clarkspoon. Another lure option is a rigging a Mini Spreader Bar made by Clarkspoon, designed to pull multiple Spoons that resemble a bait school. <a href="https://clarkspoon.com/collections/rigged-spreader-bars">https://clarkspoon.com/collections/rigged-spreader-bars</a>



Nick said Chasin' Tails has more than 15 captains who offer guided fishing trips for clients who want to fish inshore for Red Drum or offshore for Spanish. Chasin' Tails is an official NC weigh station with short term boat tie up slips for weighing fish, buying bait and tackle. The store sells live baits such as mud minnows, eels, and mole crabs for inshore fishing and cigar minnows & Ballyhoo for offshore fishing.

### Reading the Beach and Fishing Report

Arguably, when surf fishing, reading the beach to determine where to fish is as important as equipment and terminal tackle.

Dan Cooney passed along a link to a great video with the basics on how to read the structure(s) on the beach and areas which may be more productive. Courney Waznak has a series of videos which will prove useful and valuable to both the beginner and seasoned surf anglers. The link is well produced and is as good a primer as I've seen.

Often, in certain relatively small areas, fish will congregate by species and area and being off by 50 feet can often mean the difference in success or boredom.

I have seen this personally on several occasions. When fishing in the 6-angler team surf tournaments, often on an assigned 100 yard stretch of beach, the team will pile in almost on top of each other to target fish, e.g., school of bluefish located in a relatively small area.

When the Raleigh BeerBusters, AKA the "B" Team, finished 2nd in the Nags Head Tournament, most of the puppy drum we caught in a session were in a 50 ft section on the backside of the end of a sandbar rather than in the hole.

Fishing Report: A number of RSWSFC members were among friends down for an annual May surf fishing trip. On Tuesday, several of us decided to fish south of Cape Point primarily to get out of a 15-25 mph north wind. Couple of us stopped at a reasonably good looking stretch of beach with a bar, an inside slough and hole with an opening.

Fishing sand fleas on a double dropper fluor rig with #2 circle hooks, I cast into the white water breaking over the bar, spiked the rod and went to get a second rod. Immediately had a strong bite and a nice 1 1/2 pound sea mullet (aka Va mullet, whiting, kingfish, roundhead), Rebaited, cast out in the same area, and immediately had another nice one. 10 casts, 9 fish (lost one in the shore break) all in a relatively small area. I ended up keep 17 and releasing a few than day, and while Robbie Brooks and Kip Baker caught a few, clearly a school was concentrated in the white water on the back of the bar.

Sadly, the strong winds throughout the week changed this structure, widened the bar, narrowed the slough and catching fell off considerably. Week's catch was predominately sea mullet with a few pompano.

Notable catches were Robbie Brooks' 22" black drum and 2 lb sea mullet (new citation weight) and Mike McLean's

citation 3 lb pompano.

# **NOAA Fisheries Announces Limited Openings of Red Snapper 2021 Seasons**

On June 4th NOAA Fisheries announced the season opening dates for Red Snapper in federal waters of the South Atlantic, in addition to the recreational season length.

For 2021 the recreational sector will open for harvest the following 3 days: July 9, 10 and 11, 2021 (Friday, Saturday, Sunday).

The **commercial sector** will open for harvest on July 12, 2021 and close at 12:01 local time on January 1, 2022, unless the commercial annual catch limit is met or projected to be met before this date.

The **total annual catch limit** is 42,510 fish with a **recreational** annual catch limit of 29,656 fish and **commercial** annual catch limit of 124,815 pounds (12,854 fish).

The commercial trip limit is 75 pounds gutted weight. There are no minimum size limits for the recreational or commercial sectors. Read the <u>Fishery Bulletin from NOAA Fisheries</u> for additional details and an FAQ..
