Tim recommends using Salty Bay Bait's soft plastic cigar minnow as a spinner bait and suggested using Shrimposters under popping corks for trout.

RSWSFC Board Meeting Minutes Tuesday April 6, 2021

President Kevin Clemmer called the virtual BOD meeting to order at 7:00 PM. *Board Members Present:* Chuck Ward VP, Ron Reijerkerk Treasurer, Fred Adams Secretary, Robert Carroll At-Large, Tripp Adams At-Large, Tommy Peace past president, Jason Fant KMT Director, and Bo Nowell Newsletter co-editor. *Board Members Absent:* Greg Brissette At-large, Tommy Walls At-large, and Bernie McCants co-editor.

Treasurer's Report: Ron Reijerkerk reported little change in club finances. Ron pointed out the new website was not reaching new members. He suggested a letter be sent to new members by the club president welcoming them to the club and explaining "How to Login website".

The RSWSFC's KMT will be on the Big Rock Otis Landing Morehead City waterfront & weigh-in scheduled November 5-7, 2021 and rental fee has been paid. Morehead City adjusted the reservation by \$72 to reflect credit from previous year and credited it towards the Otis Landing rent which cost more to reserve. Ron said he would mail \$300 to The Southern Kingfish Association (SKA), as approved by the BOD on January 12, 2021 to sanction the RSWSFC KMT. By sanctioning the tournament, fishing teams entrants earn points which should increase participation. The club's KMT is the last tournament of the season.

KMT Director Report: Jason Fant KMT Director, committed to submitting a "Project Plan" to the BOD for review and approval next week. The plan shall provide guidance to the BOD how the KMT will be run and member responsibilities. Jason said he will send out vendors/sponsor contracts for members to sell ads and KMT sponsorships. He will include the previous year's supporters to avoid double calling on sponsors. Jason committed to the following:

Shad Outing—Bernie McCants

Roanoke River flow was high at 20,000 cubic feet per minutes making fishing & catching a bit challenging. Fortunately the weather was nice and comradery excellent.

Tip of the visor to Robert Carroll for locating some fish downstream from the launch next to the bank and calling us over (Fred Adams, captain, Tripp Adams, Mike Davis and me).

I assume the fish on the hugging the bank to get out of the strong current. We were able finally able to pick up a few fish. Attempting to cast to the bank and random casting, we definitely caught a lot more tree branches, both hanging over the bank and submerged, than fish!

In our boat, I broke the ice with the first fish on a red and yellow marabou fly that had worked in previous fly fishing shad trip. Fred caught fire with 4 fish in a short time. Most on a yellow & pink spoon (I think) Then bite stopped.

One highlight of the trip was having a full grown turkey fly out of the woods and 'buzz the tower' less than ten feet over the boat!

With approaching stormy weather and no cooperating shad, we retrieved 4 rigs (8 lures) from particular in-the-way branches and called it a day.

We ended the day with a tour of Weldon Mills Distillery near the boat launch. Very amicable folks and we purchased some locally produced whiskey.

Drive back was a bit challenging with heavy rain.

But a great outing and big thanks for to Fred for providing the boat and ride and great day on the Roanoke! Apologies for not getting the names of all the participates.

Bernie McCants—Fished Morehead City Turning Basin, Dead Tree Hole, and Rough Point west end of Shackleford Banks looking for some sea mullet for the skillet. Heard the bite had been pretty string.

Wide-open catching of small croakers and unbelievable numbers of small gray trout. All caught on blood worm FishBites on a double dropper rig with #2 Owner circle hooks, a rig I use surf fishing. But the number of gray trout were amazing. Several hundred yard of sounder marks. Maybe 20 drops in a row with at least a single, many doubles. Did find a some 12-14' fish (keepers, 1/day) on the SW end of the Turning Basin on the deep side where there was a 20 to 35' drop. Sure I averaged a fish/cast for 4 hours given the number of doubles.

Went out two days later with a buddy on a multi-species hunt and, crossing over the railroad track at 2nd and Arendall, loss the back axel of the trailer. Ironically, I was talking to buddy 2 minutes prior about going to see a business about getting a new trailer the next day

Good news, axel and wheels rolled into the media and didn't hit lower unit or any cars. Better news, a 100 yds from Tow Boat where I have boat & trailer insurance. They couldn't have been better and, after offloading stuff, they took the boat to the trailer place on a rollback!

Should have bought some Lottery tickets that day.

King Tides—Bernie

In the recent blockage of the Suez Canal with the large cargo ship, the ship was finally freed with dredging around the bow, some large tugs and using the benefit of a "king tide."

These higher (and lower) than normal tides can affect fishing both positive and negative.

King tides occur when the earth, the sun, and the moon are aligned. From my understanding, when the sun and the moon are aligned and closest to the earth, we get "king tides". The result, extreme high tides, and extreme low tides. This is because the gravitational pull is essentially "stretching" the earth. Seawater is then pulled in an upward manner causing higher tides in some areas and lower tides in others.

A higher than normal tide will cause red drum to moving into flooded marsh making targeting "tailing fish" a possibility. You might be able to explore areas formally too shallow.

Surf anglers can take advantage of the lower tides to scout the shoreline for beach structure.

On the negative, the current associated with change of higher highs and lower lows, might make some areas difficult to fish.

Chart below identifies these 'king tides' along with lunar tides and full and new moon phases. In the new and full moon phases, expect high tides in early morning and late in the day.

Might be helpful to copy and past the pic to your phone as reference as to what to expect with respect to tides when you go salt water fishing.

A helpful app I have on my phone that I use to monitor tides is *Tides Near Me*.
