

RSWSFC Virtual Club Meeting May 18, 2021

The virtual RSWSF Club Meeting was called to order at 7:00PM via ZOOM, Chuck Ward club VP introduced the speaker and meeting sponsor Nick of Chasin' Tails Tackle Shop & Guide Service.

Topic: Spanish Mackerel Fishing

Nick of Chasing Tails is a fishing guide who works at the Atlantic Beach Causeway store and joined RSWSF Club meeting via Zoom. Nick said the Spanish Mackerel bite is improving and be in full swing by the time of the club's Spanish Mackerel fishing tournament. Ocean water temperatures have been in the low 60's and will continue to warm. He said the Atlantic Bonitos are still in the area for a few more weeks, and Cobia have started showing up around Cape Lookout; catching Mahi mahi has been slow due to high winds and rough seas.

Spanish Mackerel fishing: Nick prefers using fishing rods over hand lines. He spools his reels with 20# High Viz monofilament fishing line attached to a #1 planner (sometimes #2 planner) attached to a 20' to 30' fluorocarbon leader line. His bait of choice for trolling is a size 00 Alt silver Clarkspoon which he stressed is a very small spoon. A Clarkspoon Squid is one of his favorites because it is manufactured using a ball bearing swivel that reduces twisting and spinning of the spoon. The artificial bait tied to a 20' fluorocarbon leader and #1 planner keeps the spoon several feet below the water surface. Using a #2 planner will dive the spoon deeper.

Trolling weights are an option when trolling near shore in shallow waters for Spanish Mackerel, because planners will hit bottom and trip. Once a school of Spanish is located by trolling, Nick recommends casting metal jigs such as Blue Water Candy lures or Clarkspoon casting jig towards the shoreline. The jigs need time to sink down; therefore, count off a several seconds after casting then rip the lure back towards the boat. Spanish Mackerel will chase down and hit the metal bait. Nick also suggests using these metal jigs and technique when fishing for schools of Bonito or jigging for Gray Trout. Nick's favorite casting fishing rod is a Star Rod "Sequence" Fast Taper. https://www.starfishingtackle.com/sequence-spinning-fast-taper

Another suggestion when fishing for Spanish using the center trolling rod as the long line with a "Bird" and a 20' leader with a Clarkspoon. Another lure option is a rigging a Mini Spreader Bar made by Clarkspoon, designed to pull multiple Spoons that resemble a bait school. https://clarkspoon.com/collections/rigged-spreader-bars



Nick said Chasin' Tails has more than 15 captains who offer guided fishing trips for clients who want to fish inshore for Red Drum or offshore for Spanish. Chasin' Tails is an official NC weigh station with short term boat tie up slips for weighing fish, buying bait and tackle. The store sells live baits such as mud minnows, eels, and mole crabs for inshore fishing and cigar minnows & Ballyhoo for offshore fishing.

Members socialized over a Jersey Mike's Sub dinner provided by **West Marine**, before dividing into two Demo stations. Simrad Marine Electronics, and "How to tie Bottom Rigs".

Demonstration Area #1: Joey Crisp of Simrad Marine exhibited the latest in Marine technology and electronics. He demonstrated how to use Simrad chart plotters and fish finders. Joey said Simrad Electronics

are his company's saltwater depth/fish finders, whereas Lowrance is the freshwater fisherman's depth/fish finders. He introduced "Fish Mapping" a subscription technology offered by SiriusXM that locates fish by species and advises where to fish offshore.

Demonstration Area #2:

"Tying bottom rigs and Snelling hooks"- Past presidents John Knight and Bernie McCants shared their knowledge and experience on how to tie bottom rigs. Participants received hands experience using 80# Leader and used a "fisherman's knot" to create a loop in the line for a weight, then Snelled two #7 circle hooks to the leader to create a bottom rig. Circle hooks pose less for injury to bottom fish. A fish will hook itself in the jaw as they swim away, or one reels. The circle hook hooks in the fish's jaw will prevent it from being swallowed, thus injury is minimized from what a "J" hook might cause. Pre-Planning For the Next Day's Fishing Trip Like a Pro

While many saltwater anglers just roll out of bed and head to the boat ramp, the top-notch fisherman has a different approach. It starts before the day of fishing and involves addressing a number of tasks that will likely make for a better than average day on the water. Tanya Dowdy is an instructional fishing guide located in the Charleston Low Country. Recently, she spoke with us about her preparation process for a day of inshore fishing.

The Inventory Check

Taking an inventory of the tackle box is key to the preparation process. While my rods are pre-rigged, I also want to make sure that I have plenty of backup lures in the event of break-offs or damage by the fish strikes. There is nothing worse than the most productive lure of the day getting broken off and no more in the tackle box to keep the bite going. This is also true for weights, lure variations such as color and size.

Inspection of the Line and Leaders

Every day I fish has an impact on both my line as well as my leaders. With this in mind, I make sure to take a few minutes to check my brad line for possible damage from abrasion from oyster shells or underwater structures. The same is especially true for my fluorocarbon leaders. I check for damage from structures as well as the teeth of the fish. I either remove the damaged part or replace the leader altogether. This tactic reduces the chances of a brake off far more than you think. If the leader has been used for several days, I will replace it to remove all doubt.

Hook and Lure Check

I check my lures and hooks that are rigged on my rods for damage or proper alignment. A lure that's damaged or bent hook can greatly lower the integrity of the swimming of that lure. A bent or dull hook will greatly lower the chances of a good hookup. It only takes a few minutes and it's time well spent.

Boat Preparation

I make sure that both my trolling motor batteries and batteries for my remote are charged. There's nothing worse than having a great day of fishing and your trolling motor dies, causing you to resort back to the dark ages of dropping an anchor overboard. I also check the status of the fuel filter to make sure that I've not taken on any water in the fuel system.

The Routine

I make these checks a routine. They have become a process that I do every time that I fish and I do them the same. It's an iron-clad system that is rarely changed or varied. I never allow anyone else to help me. That way "I know" nothing has been overlooked. This process is based on the way I fish and it's become a habit that I've committed to memory.

The Plan

The night before fishing, I look at the factors that will determine my fishing strategy for the next day. This means check the weather, tides, and other details. I also take a glance at what other anglers in the area are reporting on social media. While I don't plan my next day's strategy on those posts, they are another source of information.

The Results

Pre-planning your next day's fishing trip will definitely improve your results as well as give you more time to fish. Once you get started you're likely to discover many more ideas to prepare for your trips as well.

Marine Fisheries advisory committees to discuss small mesh gill net issues

July 8, 2021

Three advisory committees to the N.C. Marine Fisheries Commission will meet by web conference later this month to discuss possible future small mesh gill net management measures.

The Southern, Northern, and Finfish advisory committees will meet separately to review the Small Mesh Gill Net Rules Modification Information Paper. The paper contains an overview of the small mesh gill net fishery and presents a suite of potential management options focused on reducing regulatory complexity, potential bycatch in the fishery and user conflict. The options provided fall under four categories:

- Yardage Limits
- Attendance Requirements
- Set Time and Area Restrictions
- Mesh Size Limits

The Marine Fisheries Commission is considering moving some options forward for further development and possible rulemaking. The commission is seeking advisory committee feedback on the options before considering the issue at its August 2021 business meeting.
