Fishing For Redfish... Winter Tactics

With the colder days now upon us, it's time to change the way we fish for Redfish. With the summer pattern a thing of the past, we have to approach things differently. Winter can actually be a productive time of year for Reds. The fact is the way that the Redfish move and feed is substantially different from the way they did in the warmer months when they were much more active and aggressive. The colder weather means they move much less, and they become far more lethargic. This also means the angler has to adjust to those changes.

Just remember that while the feeding has slowed, they are still looking for food. Unlike the warm summer months when the water is warmer, the best fishing time is early morning. With the cooler water of winter, that time moves to the middle of the day when the sun has had a chance to warm the water. Also, take into mind that the days are shorter and that can only mean that the water has less time to heat up. Generally, in winter there are either fewer or no real hotspots. This means you have to work a little harder for your catch using tactics like looking for deep channels and structure.

If possible, use live bait when you can. Remember winter Reds are more about looking for food and less about attacking the invading baitfish. Also, slow that retrieve. With the Redfish being more lethargic, they are not as aggressive to move quickly. If live bait is not available, then consider cut baits. In colder temperature reds will limit their movement throughout the day, and as they seek to conserve energy, you will notice success by using smaller lures. While most anglers find success with a 4-to-5 inch soft-plastic jerk, during the winter you will see progress with a 3-inch wobbling spoon with a single hook. You can also look at using a spoon since redfish like the exact size and profile, and the wiggle will grab the attention of reds in the area. Retrieve the spoon slowly to keep them in the optimal strike zone for as long as possible, redfish will not pursue the bait since they don't want to burn a lot of energy.

Since Redfish move less during chilly winter months, you will want a slow retrieve, and this means you want to keep the bait in the water as long as possible. To achieve this you will want to land longer distance, and many anglers have found success with a medium-action spinning rod with a fast tip. A 7-foot spinning rod with a fast rod tip flexes easily and helps propel smaller baits longer distances so you can draw in more Reds with each cast.

RSWSFC Board Meeting Minutes Tuesday January 12, 2021

President Kevin Clemmer called the virtual BOD meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Board Members Present: Robert Carroll, Chuck Ward, Tommy Peace, Tommy Walls Tripp Adams, Ron Reijerkerk Treasurer, Bo Nowell Newsletter Editor and Fred Adams Secretary.

Board Members Absent: Greg Brissette At-large

Treasurer's Report: Ron Reijerkerk reported the Club had collected \$5,415.00 from dues and sponsor memberships. Including Club expenses, such as club T-shirt cost, insurance, storage expenses etc. the club has an operating loss of (\$1,526.77) quarter ending December 30, 2020. According to the Treasurer the club holds an inventory of T-shirts & Performance shirts available for sale, through the sale of these shirts, the club has the potential to breakeven. The artwork on the shirts does not reference a year; therefore, the shirts can be sold at this year's 2021 KMT.

Ron reported the club carries BOD Liability insurance and he suggested we review the need to continue the policy. The board voted to TABLE the issue until it could research, investigate, and discuss with our insurance agent the need before renewing or canceling the policy for 2021.

Tripp Adams reported the club had received a bill for club website Domain from Go Daddy; he presented the bill to the Treasurer for payment.

Old Business

Kevin Clemmer reported he had received a \$300 proposal from SKA to sanction the Raleigh Saltwater Sportfishing Club KMT 2021.

Motion #1

Fred Adams Moved, and Ron Reijerkerk seconded, that RSWSFC pay SKA \$300 and plan to hold the 2021 KMT at Morehead City waterfront July 31, 2021. Motion Passed Unanimously.

The BOD agreed to proceed to move forward with planning for a Tournament to be held Saturday July 31st, 2021, assuming concerns regarding the pandemic will have ended. Tommy Peace, acting KMT Chair, agreed to review the SKA proposal and talk with their representative; he will also reach out to Morehead City about reserving the Jaycee's waterfront park as tournament headquarters.

Kevin asked Ron if he would continue to communicate and send reminders to RSWSFC members using Mail Chimp, and Ron agreed.

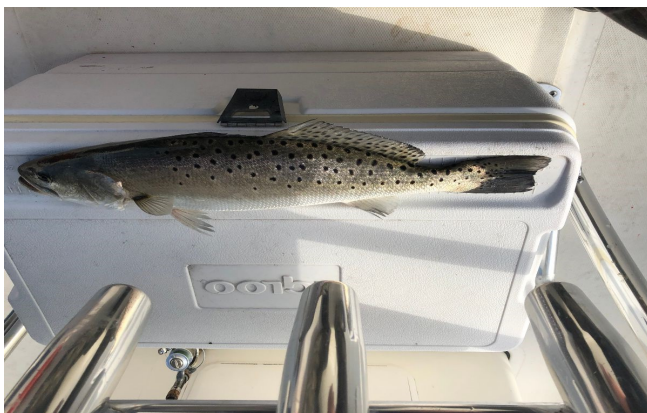

U.S. Senate Sends DESCEND Act to President

The U.S. Senate passed without objection H.R. 5126, Direct Enhancement of Snapper Conservation and the Economy through Novel Devices Act of 2020 (DESCEND Act). The bipartisan bill requires recreational (including charter boats) and commercial fishermen to have on board a venting tool or descending device that is rigged and ready for use while fishing for reef fish in Gulf of Mexico federal waters. The recreational fishing and boating community strongly supports the DESCEND Act, which was co-authored in the Senate by Senators Bill Cassidy (R-La.), Doug Jones (D-Ala.) and John Cornyn (R-Texas) to conserve Gulf reef fish.

The DESCEND Act passed the U.S. House on October 1, and was led by Congressmen Garret Graves (R-La.), Jared Huffman (D-Calif.) and Steve Palazzo (R-Miss.), to combat wanton waste of Gulf of Mexico reef fish.

Red snapper and other reef fish are often returned to the water for a variety of reasons (e.g., being caught out of season, under the size limit, or over the bag limit). Due to the rapid change in pressure from being brought to the surface from depth many of these fish experience barotrauma – a condition where a buildup of gas pressure in their bodies makes it difficult or impossible to swim back down. Consequently, countless fish die at the surface or fall victim to opportunistic predators. This is an economic and conservation travesty. Unfortunately, a bureaucratic roadblock related to an important oil spill recovery-funded project has prevented regulation from moving forward at the Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council that would address this problem

New 2021 Harvest Season Established for Striped Bass on the Roanoke River

RALEIGH, N.C. (Jan. 15, 2021) – The N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission issued a proclamation outlining significant changes to the 2021 striped bass harvest season in the Roanoke River Management Area. Striped bass open harvest dates will be:

April 10–16 in the lower river zone (downstream of the U.S. Highway 258 bridge at Scotland Neck to the mouth at Albemarle Sound).

April 24–30 in the upper river zone (upstream of the Highway U.S. 258 bridge at Scotland Neck to the base of Roanoke Rapids Dam)

Changes to the season framework became necessary when the harvest quota in the Roanoke River was reduced from 68,750 pounds to 12,800 pounds. The reduction was deemed a necessary conservation action intended to rebuild the striped bass population. Results from a 2020 stock assessment of the Roanoke River/Albemarle Sound conducted by the N.C. Division of Marine Fisheries, with assistance from the Wildlife Commission, indicated that the stock was overfished and overfishing was occurring.

The separate weeks selected in each river zone coincide with the highest average weekly harvest totals observed by Wildlife Commission fisheries staff over the last nine years.

“As harvest options were considered, we identified the days where harvest was historically the highest in each area of the river. Although the timing of fish migration into the river is different each spring, daily harvest during the two weekly periods selected averaged between 700 and 1,300 pounds of striped bass per day,” said Commission Coastal Fisheries Supervisor Chad Thomas.

Size limits and daily creel limits will remain the same. During the two separate harvest periods, the minimum length limit is 18 inches, and no striped bass between 22 and 27 inches (the protective slot) may be possessed at any time. The daily creel limit is two fish, only one of which may be larger than 27 inches.

“For decades our primary concern on the Roanoke has been having enough water in the river during April and May to provide optimum spawning conditions”, said Thomas. “The reverse is now true, where we are dealing regularly with periods of heavy rainfall and extreme high flow events that flush fertilized eggs and fry out of the river channel and into the floodplain where survival is limited at best.”

The N.C. Estuarine Striped Bass Fishery Management Plan is in the process of being amended, and additional management strategies to aid with stock recovery on the Roanoke River will be identified and presented to the public for input in late 2021.

Despite the shortened harvest season, anglers can continue to catch and release striped bass throughout the spring. To reduce handling stress on fish that are released, the Commission recommends anglers use a single barbless hook or a lure with a single barbless hook, a requirement from April 1 through June 30 when fishing in the upper Roanoke River zone above the US Highway 258 bridge near Scotland Neck.

Signage will be posted at boating access areas (BAAs) along the Roanoke River to notify anglers of the changes to the open harvest dates. More information about boating access areas on the Roanoke River can be found using the agency’s online BAA locator.
