

# Drum Fishing on the Neuse – August 8–9 By Tripp Adams

I spent August 8–9 fishing with some extended family who have a place on the South River. We worked the south side of the Neuse, mainly around West Bay, with a steady northeast wind at 11–14 mph.

The first evening delivered steady action — three puppy drum, three bluefish, a few rays, six old drum, plus both slot and over-slot fish. The next morning added four more old drum to the tally.

We fished a mix of Lupton rigs: lighter setups for the puppy drum and heavier rigs for the old drum. Once we had a few slots, we switched entirely to the heavier gear.

Bait was mostly cut mullet, with some bluefish and a little blue crab mixed in. Most of our casts were 75–125 yards off the bank, targeting deeper water where the fish were moving through.

It was a productive couple of days on the water — the kind of trip that makes August on the Neuse worth looking forward to every year. Pictures on next page.


